- Do we really need a social contract to create community? And does Community need government (a state)? Locke, Smith, and Polanyi
- John Locke
- Locke's imagined "state of nature"
 - Humans are born a "blank slate"
 - A state of perfect equality
 - Bound by the law of nature
 - Nature gives us Rights! Noone should harm another in life, health, liberty or possessions
 - The state of nature is a state of perfect freedom
 - Or is it?
- Vigilante Justice in the state of nature
 - We are probably not naturally compassionate
 - But we obey the law of nature which gives us a moral duty to restrict our behavior!
- Locke's political economy in the state of nature: The right to property
 - "God" put us on earth,
 - he did not put us here to starve.
 - But we will starve unless we can rightfully consume apples and acorns in peace
 - individuals can peacefully consume if they can securely possess plots of land and rightfully exclude others.
 - Property ownership leads to PEACE!

- Locke's reasoning for why we enter create a government to form community
- Adam Smith on Human Nature and the Division of Labor
- Smith on human nature: Three aspects

1. People are naturally sociable and seek help from others to get what they want and need

- 2. People are first and foremost self-interested
- 3. People have a disposition to "truck, barter, and exchange."
 - This is the basis of the "market"
 - It gives rise to the concept of "Economic Man"
 - It is the basic assumption about human nature of all modern economic theory
- So..... If Everyone is self-interested, how do we get what we want?
- These three characteristics lead to a natural division of labor among people
- We Specialize not because of our inherent skills but because of demand.
- This is Contrary to Aristotle and Steve Jobs
- How can we know what human nature really is? Science?
 - biology and anthropology: there was never a period in human evolution when human beings existed as isolated individuals
- Science, state of nature, and human nature
- Is cooperation more natural than competition? Is Hobbes Wrong?
